

Absent from school? What to do

A reminder that absences from school need to be explained by notification from the child's family / carers. This allows teachers to complete the register of attendance (roll) according to Government policy. Absences can be notified by phone call, email or written note to the class teacher or front office. The front office will make contact via text message in the case of unexplained absences.

If students arrive after 9:15am, they are to go to the front office accompanied by a parent / carer and be signed in by office staff. Students will then receive a 'late slip' to hand to class teachers. This informs the teacher the student has been signed in.

From the English Action Team: Early Literacy and Letter Recognition





Letter recognition is important because it helps build knowledge of letters to support beginning readers to figure out how printed text is associated with the spoken language. It is the foundation for learning to read and write. Many children at preschool are aware that printed text makes meaning. They are surrounded by environmental print and recognise familiar signs and labels. We take advantage of opportunities to introduce letters in everyday preschool life. For example, pointing out the letters when reading and writing notes.

At preschool we expose children in a fun, stress-free and positive way through games and hands on activities to support the process of laying down foundational pre-reading and writing skills. Just as children learn to walk and talk at different ages, the same is true for recognising letters of the alphabet. They each learn at their own pace. Children typically look for letters they are familiar with. One of the very first words with great importance will be their own name.

We harness that interest through a transition activity where children are shown capital letters. The aim is for children to recognise the letter and say either their own name or children's names in the class that start with that letter. Some children may also find other names that are important to them from their family, others enjoy the challenge of finding words that start with that letter. Next, they will begin expanding their letter knowledge to the rest of the alphabet. Eventually, these skills grow into the ability to start identifying and associating uppercase and lowercase letters.

Some other fun activities we present are:

Magnetic letters and a magnetic fishing line. Children fish for letters. There are many conversations going on such as "I have that letter in my name", "my name starts with"

What letter is missing? game. Showing children a small group of letters, taking one away and the children have to guess which letter is missing.

Making playdough letters.

Reading lots and lots of books.

Singing songs and rhymes. Singing the ABC song.

Hiding letters in sensory materials.
