Each year ACT public schools invite families to make a financial contribution to support educational programs; this voluntary contribution is a valuable source of funding which assists the purchase of learning materials and school resources that may not otherwise be purchased.

In 2022 the School Board plan to use money from voluntary contributions for outdoor learning and play space upgrades. A consultation process is underway with students, community and staff in term one to develop a masterplan for these upgrades. Work with then commence and continue over a five-year period. The goal is to raise \$20 000 from voluntary contributions to add to the budget for upgrades in 2022.
