

Masterplan update

We continue to make progress on installing elements of the masterplan developed last year with <u>Wellspring</u>. This semester we hope to see three new projects underway or completed.

Shade structure for Cameron hardtop

Over the April holidays a shade structure will be installed over the Cameron hardtop. This will be funded by the Education Directorate and will enable learning outdoors in all weather conditions. Once installed the next step will be to redo line markings for basketball and netball courts and install new hoops. The line markings will be donated by a generous Farrer family. We sincerely hope the new hoops will be looked after and not broken again by people who use them outside of school hours.

Extension to senior playground equipment

Last week year six student parliament members consulted with all senior classes to make a final decision on the new equipment to be added to the existing senior playground equipment. The new components will provide lots of opportunities for climbing, balancing and swinging. The children are very excited about the extension. Now that the decision has been made it will take approximately 10-12 weeks for manufacturing and delivery. We will then see landscaping and installation occur.

Maze extension

The maze next to the junior play equipment proved very popular with children during the masterplan consultation process. For this reason the maze will be extended with the addition of new sections on three sides as well as landscaping and soft fall. We will keep you up to date on the timeline for this project.

The senior playground equipment and maze extensions will be funded using money allocated within the 2023 school budget.

Early next term families will be invited to make a voluntary contribution which will be used to fund another element of the masterplan. We will begin talking with the designer about what element will be possible.






Good readers ask questions before, during and after reading to help them understand what they are reading. Readers should ask questions if they wonder something about the book, if something is confusing to them, if they want to check a word or some information or if they want to learn more about a topic they have read. Asking questions before reading and then coming back to those questions at the end, is a great way to build comprehension skills.


Ways you can support your child while reading:

- Before beginning reading, write or talk about a question you have about the book.
- Write questions they have, while reading on a post-it note. Stick the post-it note in the book to reflect on after reading.
- Model asking questions as you listen to your child read. Ask them what they think will
 happen next, wonder about a character's feelings, show confusion over the meaning of a
 word or enquire about another element of the topic.
- After reading, discuss the questions the child had and whether they found their answer or whether more information needs to be found.















News from Year 3


Sports Achievements


