
Messages from our Principal - Ms Liz Wallace



What did you do at school today?

A lot happens in a school day so this question is often met with the response 'nothing' which can be quite disappointing to hear. A positive way to encourage your child to reflect on their school day is to ask them to share two stars and a wish. Two stars for two things they enjoyed or were highlights and a wish which is something they hope happens the next day. Some families choose to do two stars and a wish at the dinner table with each member of the family sharing their stars and a wish from the day. This models to children how the process of reflection works and also teaches them that everyone has positives and things they wish could be better or different in the future. We encourage all families to try two stars and a wish, keep in mind it might take a few weeks to get into the groove of reflecting and sharing.

ACT School Satisfaction & Climate Survey 2023



Each year, the Education Directorate surveys all parents and carers, school staff and students in Years 4 to 12 about their experience of public education.

The 2023 School Satisfaction & Climate Survey will be available online from 18 August to 8 September.

The survey results will help us continue to make quality, informed decisions about how to improve our school. No personal identifying information will be provided to any school or college.

For each child in your family who attends an ACT public school, you will receive:

- a letter about the student survey outlining the reasons for collection and privacy provision for the data; and
- an email about the parent survey, including a unique link to access the survey.

Genuine survey invitation emails will have the title "The 2023 School Satisfaction & Climate Survey is now open!" and will be sent from EDU Surveys & Evaluation with 'from' address EDU@qualtrics-survey.com.

If you do not receive the survey invitation, please check your Junk email folder; if it is not there, please contact mariana.fuenzalida@ed.act.edu.au.

Similarly if you do not have an email listed with the school, please email mariana.fuenzalida@ed.act.edu.au.

The Parents and Carers Survey will be available online in other languages: Arabic, Burmese, Chinese, Hindi, Korean, Urdu, Vietnamese, Punjabi, Bengali, Spanish, Telugu, French and Italian. You can select your preferred language when you start the survey.

A shortened paper-version of the Parents and Carers Survey is also available in the following 5 languages: Dari, Dinka, Farsi, Karen and Mon. These surveys are available at the Front Office.



News from the English Action Team



Early literacy and Listening to stories

At preschool the children listen to stories every day. We also read factual texts. We work on building a thesaurus in their minds e.g. big, huge, enormous, massive, humungous. All these words may come into play one day as they are learning to read. We look at the illustrations and lot of conversation happens around the words in books.

Other fun ways with letters and words:

- playing with new words such as counting, tapping or segmenting a word into syllables is a game that helps the children to become familiar with it;
- acting out favourite rhymes and stories also helps children to become familiar with language of books; and
- being a letter or word detective. Use a magnifying glass or binoculars.

Ways to use this activity with:

P: find words that start with the same letter as the students name.

K: letter/sound focus

Yr 1-2: find blends and digraphs letter combinations e.g. cr, bl, dr, th, ch, sh

Yr 3-6: identify class spelling focus e.g. long a sound







Some of Mem Fox's read aloud commandments.

- Spend at least ten wildly happy minutes every single day reading aloud.
- Read at least three stories a day: it may be the same story three times. Children need to hear a thousand stories before they can begin to learn to read.
- Read with joy and enjoyment: real enjoyment for yourself and great joy for the listeners.
- Read the stories that the kids love, over and over and over again, and always read in the same 'tune' for each book: i.e. with the same intonations on each page, each time.

- Let children hear lots of language by talking to them constantly about the pictures, or anything else connected to the book; or sing any old song that you can remember; or say nursery rhymes in a bouncy way; or be noisy together doing clapping games.
- Look for rhyme, rhythm or repetition in books for young children, and make sure the books are really short.
- Play games with the things that you and the child can see on the page, such as letting kids finish rhymes, and finding the letters that start the child's name and yours.


Various News from Farrer PS



NAIDOC Incursion

Last week years 1-6 had a visit from Ronnie Jordan, a Kalkadoon Pitta Pitta woman. Ronnie spoke with us about how First Nations People use resources from the land to do things like fishing, hunting, cooking and gathering. Children got the chance to pass around a *woomera*, a digging tool used by women and a *boudi*, a large piece of wood used to transport food. Children had the opportunity to create their own story using canvas and paints. Ronnie shared with the students different Indigenous symbols and their meanings. Children were encouraged to use these in their paintings to support their storytelling.









Soccer @ Breaktimes

Over the past week, a group of year 5 children have been working with Mr Maron to learn how to referee soccer games for junior school children at break times.

The group has looked at and learnt about the school soccer rules and have had a go at running a game with some year 1 children.

Everyone now knows the school expectations and rules to be followed when playing soccer.

We thank Mr Maron and Yr 5 volunteers for their efforts and look forward to seeing children engage successfully in the game they love.








Chief Minister's Reading Challenge 2023
