Who is Floyd?

Bullying No Way

Tomorrow was marked on the calendar as the National Day of Action Against Bullying and Violence. A decision was made this week to move this national day due to NAPLAN testing occurring in schools across the country. The National Day of Action Against Bullying and Violence will now be acknowledged in August. Classes at Farrer will still revisit and discuss bullying over the next week as it is an important reminder for the start of each school year.

Unfortunately bullying can occur in schools. At Farrer we take this seriously and work with children and their families to understand what bullying is, the impact it has, how to repair harm, how to avoid using bullying and how to report it.

If bullying is identified we discuss it with children using the Bullying No Way definition:

Bullying is an ongoing and deliberate misuse of power in relationships through repeated verbal, physical and/or social behaviour that intends to cause physical, social and/or psychological harm. It can involve an individual or a group misusing their power, or perceived power, over one or more persons who feel unable to stop it from happening. Bullying can happen in person or online, via various digital platforms and devices and it can be obvious (overt) or hidden (covert). Bullying behaviour is repeated, or has the potential to be repeated, over time (for example, through sharing of digital records). Bullying of any form or for any reason can have immediate, medium and long-term effects on those involved, including bystanders. Single incidents and conflict or fights between equals, whether in person or online, are not defined as bullying.

We work with the child displaying the bullying behaviour and the victim of the bullying and always inform and discuss with families. We have found this approach powerful in the past as it names the behaviour and generally sees it cease. If bullying behaviours continue we escalate consequences

using our school procedures. Next term we will be sharing with families all of our wellbeing procedures in one document so please keep an eye out for this.


Thank yous



From the English Action Team: Identifying sounds in words



One of the first steps in being able to read and write is being able to tell the difference between sounds. Parents and teachers help children to tell different sounds apart orally (known as sound discrimination) when they identify that 'ant' starts with 'a' and 'ball' starts with 'b'. Learning to identify beginning letter sounds links children's oral language skills to their understanding of written language.

When reading with children, stopping and asking 'what sound can you hear at the start of 'ant'?' helps build this skill. From here you could ask 'what other words do you know that start with that sound?' At school we build on this knowledge by talking about all the different words that start with that sound or letter. We then draw and write other words that start with our focus letter or sound.







Linking children's knowledge of oral language and what the letter or sound looks like is a great way to build literacy. Once children know the initial sound, children hear, identify and record the final and then medial (middle) sound. Once these skills are developed, children further extend this knowledge by noticing the differences in spelling the same sound such as the long 'a' sound in rain, play and eight.

When next reading with your child, ask them what they know about sounds they hear. Some children might like to create their own word book at home.

Chief Minister's Reading Challenge

Every year, tens of thousands of students across the ACT participate in the Chief Minister's Reading Challenge. This year the challenge runs until 11 August 2023.


Farrer Primary School is joining in the fun. We are aiming for each class to read at least 30 books.

Children can also join in at home and see how many books they can read and record these on the individual record sheet.

The individual record sheet is a Google Form for Year 3-6 and a paper form for Kindergarten-Year 2. Students in Years 3-6 will have access to the Google Form in their google classroom. For K-2 students, individual record forms will be sent home via class teachers. If you need another one, please ask your child's class teacher.

To get the most out of the Challenge, we encourage children to try choosing books from different genres and sharing their favourite books and stories with classmates. Children can choose their own books or ask friends, family and people at school for their suggestions. This year, we encourage children to read something different!

We are looking forward to the Challenge and marvelling at all the journeys reading can take us on!

Canteen




