In 2021, we focused on:

Governance

- Rewriting the P&C Constitution
- Developing ToR for the canteen and uniform shop sub committees
- Developing hospitality agreements for canteen volunteers

Risk

- Developing a standard risk assessment for events and activities
- Developing risk assessments for the canteen and uniform shop businesses

Strategy

 Developing a 5 year strategy to focus the events and continue the momentum between P&C committee years

Sustainability

Receiving a \$20,000 grant to improve waste outcomes at the FPS canteen.

Providing services

The P&C continued to offer the Uniform Shop and Canteen services for students and families of FPS. The uniform shop moved to a new web portal to improve functionality to parents and increase inventory control.

Advocacy

In 2021, we actively participated in meetings held by the ACT Council of P&C regarding COVID19 school closures and restrictions, including feedback provided directly to the Minister for Education.

Collaboration

We continued a collaborative, constructive and mutually respectful relationship with the FPS Principal and executive staff. This relationship allows for a strong flow of information and early identification of issues and opportunities

Fundraising

We raised approximately \$6,000 from events in 2021 and were proud to allocate some fundraising funds to the following means,

• \$10,000 to be provided for play based elements of the FPS landscape plan in 2022

- \$4,500 to be used for funding whole school excursions in 2022
- \$1,000 to be used for improvements to books in the FPS library in 2022.

Fundraising in 2021 was difficult due to school closures and COVID-19 restrictions. Additional fundraising from the uniform shop will be available in 2022 now that it has reached a sustainable model.

We tried a different format for the Stall this year, with a focus on reduced waste and volunteer preparation time. The kids loved having the opportunity to buy a gift for someone special in their life, however the event ran at a loss (approx \$20). We will review the format for next year's event.


Recycled Clothing Sale

For school support day, a morning tea, sponsored by the Fox & Bow was provided.


Grade 6 Gradation Support


\$250 was provided to support the 2020 graduating class celebrations and this will likely be repeated in 2021.
