

Masterplan update

Last year we engaged the team from Wellspring to consult with students, staff and families in order to develop a playground masterplan. The masterplan incorporates a range of upgrades and new spaces for learning and play. The upgrades will be completed over the next five - seven years with funds available in the school budget along with funds obtained through grant opportunities and donations.

At the end of 2022 the bike track was installed. Over the summer break the community meeting space was completed.

The next project in the upgrade is extending the Cameron play equipment.

We will also see the installation of a roof over the Cameron hardtop area in coming months followed by replacement of basketball and netball hoops and remarking of courts. The roof installation will be funded by the Education Directorate.

Information for Kindergarten families

Kindergarten Health Check

ACT Health have advised that the Kindergarten Health Check will take place on 20th and 21st of July (Term 3 week 1). The checks will take place at school starting at 9.15am.

The 2023 check includes vision, hearing and growth (height, weight and Body Mass Index). Families have received a questionnaire that includes the Parent Evaluation of Developmental Status (PEDS), Strengths and Difficulties Questionnaire(SDQ) and Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs).

As a follow up to the health check, parents / guardians are encouraged to make an appointment with their General Practitioner to review results and undertake a more comprehensive assessment of their child.

Envelopes containing information about the checks were sent home in week 2. We ask that these please be returned to school by 7 March 2023 as this is when they will be collected by the school health team.

BASE - Kindergarten assessment

This week, Kindergarten teachers have been conducting the BASE assessment program with our 2023 Kindergarten cohort.

The early years assessment program uses BASE to assess early reading, phonics and numeracy skills of students in their first year of school. There are two assessments, with the first occurring in Term 1 and the second in Term 4.

BASE data is used to identify, as early as possible, students who may need extra support or enrichment. The data helps teachers plan appropriate learning experiences for every child in the class.

BASE reports are available to the school principal and relevant teachers to assist with planning and teaching in the classroom. The BASE results are part of the wide range of assessment information collected by teachers.

<u>Individual student reports</u> using BASE results are provided to parents during term two and term four.

Parents and carers are encouraged to discuss their child's progress with teachers, establishing a partnership that supports their child's future learning.

This service includes four modern and interactive sessions each year (one per term and varied each year), prepared professionally and delivered by trained and endorsed volunteers. The one-hour sessions are designed for groups of students to discuss and explore the topics outlined in the image.

Parent permission is essential for children to participate in CEIS. Please use the section below if you would like to request this for your child. Requests remain in effect while your child is at their school, but can be changed by contacting the front office. Each CEIS session will be advertised in the school newsletter.
