Communication with the school

Our main communication tool is this newsletter which is emailed to each family every second Thursday. Please take the time to read the newsletter for important information and updates. If you are not receiving the newsletter please chat with Trudy at Reception to ensure your details are up to date.

We aim to send any additional notes home on Thursday each week and also upload them to the school <u>website</u>. Family notes are sent home with the eldest child and individual class notes with each child. Today K-6 children will bring home a note about the swimming carnival and year six students will have another excursion note also.

We use Facebook for reminders and celebrations.

Absences can be sent to the <u>info@farrerps.act.edu.au</u> email address or via a response sent to the automated text sent each morning for any unexplained absences.

At information sessions next week teachers will provide their email addresses. Our class teachers have the most information about each child's learning program and day to day interactions at school. We encourage families to connect with class teachers as the first contact with questions, wonderings or worries. Our teachers and support staff access email during work hours and aim to respond within 24 hours. If you feel you still need more information or support following connecting with the teacher the team leader is the next contact.



Positive Behaviours for Learning (PBL) expectations

This week classes are discussing expectations across the school and in their classrooms. Our four school expectations are:

SAFE RESPECTFUL RESPONSIBLE LEARNER

You will see and hear these words often. The colours correspond to the tokens given to students to acknowledge the display of these expectations. Please ask your children what these words mean to them and how they can display them at school.



What did you do at school today?

A lot happens in a school day so this question is often met with the response 'nothing' which can be quite disappointing to hear. A positive way to encourage your child to reflect on their school day is to ask them to share *two stars and a wish*. Two stars for two things they enjoyed or were highlights and a wish which is something they hope happens the next day. Some families choose to do two stars and a wish at the dinner table with each member of the family sharing their stars and a wish from the day. This models to children how the process of reflection works and also teaches them that everyone has positives and things they wish could be better or different in the future. We encourage all families to try two stars and a wish, keep in mind it might take a few weeks to get into the groove of reflecting and sharing.

Staff training - Berry Street Education Model

Last week staff participated in days one and two of the Berry Street Education Model training. The Berry Street Education Model (BSEM) provides strategies that enables teachers to increase engagement of students with complex, unmet learning needs and to successfully improve *all* students' self-regulation, relationships, wellbeing, growth and academic achievement.

The day one focus was 'body' and staff learnt a range of strategies for de-escalation, mindfulness, self-regulation and being present, grounded and centred.

The day two focus was 'relationships' and included theory and strategies for attachment, unconditional positive regard, redefining power, empathy, process praise, active constructive responding and teacher self care.

This term classes will be implementing brain breaks and a morning circle as strategies to engage and focus on learning and connecting.

Days three and four of the Berry Street Education Model training will occur in January 2024.

Play equipment is not supervised by staff before or after school. Please chat with your children about pick up locations so they know where to meet you each afternoon.

Staying COVID Smart in 2023

Being COVID Smart remains a priority for all ACT public schools in 2023.

Students, staff and visitors are reminded to:

- Stay home if unwell and get tested for COVID-19
- Stay up to date with your vaccinations
- Practise good hand and respiratory hygiene

• Physically distance from others when in public places

Individual schools may implement additional measures to manage COVID-19 if deemed necessary in a particular setting. Any changes will be communicated to parents and carers.

If your child has COVID-19, you must let the school know. We recommend keeping your child home for at least five days.

RATs are again available from the school for students in term 1 from the front office.

Safe parking around schools

The start of the school year is a particularly busy time in our school carparks and surrounding streets. It's important that we park safely and legally to support the safety of students.

Parking on a footpath, nature strip or roadside verge can:

- Cause safety risks for pedestrians as they are less visible to oncoming cars
- Increase the risk for vulnerable members of our community like children, people who are visually impaired, and those using a wheelchair or pram
- · Restrict the line of sight for other road users
- Restrict access for emergency services vehicles.

Parking on nature strips can also damage trees, footpaths, gutters and underground pipes and cables. Please also remember not to park across driveways or block neighbouring residents' properties.

As students return to school remember to also slow down and stick to the 40km/h limit around our schools between 8am and 4pm.

Parking inspectors regularly patrol school zones to support safe parking and keep students safe.

If you cannot find a car park in our school car parks, we suggest parking a little further away and walking or riding the rest of the way – it's a quick and easy was to get in some exercise too.

Let's all work together to keep our kids and community safe!
